VORWORT INTRO

Liebe Freund*innen der Nacht,

herzlich Willkommen zur dritten STADT NACH ACHT– und fünften NIGHTS Konferenz! Nach unserer erfolgreichen Kooperation 2018 in Brüssel mit unserem Konferenz Partner NIGHTS, kommen 2019 in Berlin mehr nationale und internationale Spezialist*innen der Nacht sowie politische Vertreter*innen zusammen, als je zuvor. Einen Tag nach der Verleihung des APPLAUS Musikspielstättenpreises in Berlin, präsentieren wir ein umfangreiches Programm an drei Tagen, dass Akteur*innen aus den Bereichen Kultur und Design, Prävention und Schadensminderung, Sicherheit und Stadtentwicklung, Musik und Nachtkonomie sowie Politik und Verwaltung zusammen bringt – mit dem Anspruch: Nacht.Gestalten.

Wenn wir zurückblicken stellen wir fest, dass sich viel getan hat bei Themen, mit denen wir uns bei STADT NACH ACHT beschäftigt haben: Es gibt in Berlin nun ein erstes Drug Checking Pilotprojekt für Deutschland! In den vergangenen Jahren hatten wir das DC-Labor aus der Schweiz, aus Spanien sowie den Drug Checking Bus aus Wien nach Berlin geholt, und dazu politische Gespräche geführt. Auch gibt es mittlerweile ein mit aktuell einer Million Euro ausgestattetes Schallschutzprogramm für Clubs in Berlin – und zahlreiche Städte, die sich dieses Konzept anschauen – und adaptieren wollen. Die Zahl der Nachtbotschafter*innen wächst national wie international beachtlich: Dieses Jahr begrüßen wir, neben den nationalen Netzwerken, internationale Vertreter*innen aus New York, Zürich, Budapest, Prag, Vilnius, Barcelona, Groningen, Antwerpen, Nijmegen, Madrid, Amsterdam, Brüssel, San Francisco, Paris, Genf, Wien und weiteren Metropolen. Ihnen bereiten wir seit dem Start der STADT NACH ACHT immer eine besondere Bühne, um unser gemeinsames Ziel für ein spannendes, gesundes, sicheres und ökonomisch chancenreicheres Nachtleben voran zu bringen.

2019 setzen wir auch neue Schwerpunkte: Das Lichtfestival widmet sich solchen Fragen wie nach dem Verlust der Nacht, nach Sicherheit durch Beleuchtung und dem starken, visuell gestalterischen Einfluss von Licht in der Nacht. Mit der Keta-Konferenz stellen wir erstmals eine Substanz im Kontext der Nacht in den Vordergrund. Dabei geht es nicht nur um deren Wirkung, Konsumrealität und ihrem medizinischen Potential, sondern auch um die Frage, ob in Berlin oder Europa von einem Ketamin-Boom gesprochen werden kann. Einen weiteren Schwerpunkt legen wir auf die Frage der Entwicklung der Innenstädte: In den meisten Ländern Europas häufen sich die Erkenntnisse, dass sich Ladenflächen in den Zentren immer schwieriger vermieten lassen. Wir nennen es „Amazon Age“ und gehen dabei der Frage nach, ob die (Nacht-)Kultur solche funktionslos gewordenen Flächen mit neuem Leben füllen kann. Welche stadtplanerische Rolle kann für Deutschland eine geänderte Bau-nutzungsverordnung, die Musikspielstätten als Kulturstätten definiert, spielen?

Dear friends of the night,

Welcome to the third STADT NACH ACHT—and fifth NIGHTS conference! Following the successful cooperation with our conference partner NIGHTS in Brussels last year, a record number of national and international specialists of the night—as well as political representatives—will be congregating in Berlin this year. One day after the awards ceremony for the nationwide venue programme prize “Applause” takes place in Berlin, we will be presenting an extensive 3-day programme aimed at bringing together leaders from fields such as culture and design, prevention and harm reduction, safety and urban development, music and night-time economy—as well as from politics and administration—with a common aspiration: to shape the night.

Looking back, we notice that much has happened around topics we've focussed on at STADT NACH ACHT in past years. In Berlin the first ever Drug Checking pilot project in Germany has been launched! In recent years we've invited the DC-Laboratory from Switzerland, and the Drug Checking Bus from Vienna to Berlin, with whom we've initiated political discourse. Currently there is also a new soundproofing program for clubs in Berlin—which has been funded with one million Euros. Numerous cities have taken a closer look at this concept in order to adapt it. The number of Night Ambassadors has grown noticeably on a national and international scale: this year we will be welcoming—in addition to our nationwide networks—international representatives from New York, Zurich, Budapest, Prague, Vilnius, Barcelona, Groningen, Antwerp, Nijmegen, Madrid, Amsterdam, Brussels, San Francisco, Paris, Geneva, Vienna and other metropoles. Since the beginning of STADT NACH ACHT, we've offered our guests a unique platform, through which we can advance our common desire for an exciting, healthy and economically promising nightlife.

In 2019 we've also set some new focal points: the Light Festival is pursuing issues such as the loss of night, safety and illumination, and the strong, visually artistic influences of light in the night. For the first time with the Keta Conference, we will be emphasizing a specific substance in relation to the night. This involves not only the effects, the reality behind the consumption and its medical potential, but also the question of whether we can currently speak of a “ketamine boom” in Berlin and Europe. Further emphasis will be placed on the matter of development in city centres: in most European countries, there is an increasingly apparent realisation that downtown retail spaces are becoming more and more difficult to rent. We call this the “Amazon Age,” and we are following up on the question of whether (night) culture can fill such non-functional spaces with new life. Which role can a modified federal land utilisation ordinance play for Germany, while defining music venues as cultural sites?

Saturday—our public day—is dedicated to topics such as “Dance & Space of Urgency”: When partying takes on political overtones, and dancing becomes a statement for a fairer world, then we distance ourselves somewhat from the hedonism of recent decades. From Mexico to Belarus, from Hungary to Ukraine—but also in major cities and across the German countryside—cultural actors are making an important contribution to creating a more liveable, tolerant and diverse society, through demonstrations, parades, mobile discotheques and numerous other forms of cultural exchange. To that extent, nighttime culture—in which we also include festivals—is a driving force and expression of societal transformation, as well as a platform for open exchange and safer spaces for marginalised groups and people outside of the mainstream.

Regardless of whether you are a speaker, panelist, attendee, volunteer or staff member, in the spotlight or behind the scenes of the conference: all of our expertise and input is invaluable, and we are looking forward to some exciting conversations, realisations and the upkeep of old and new contacts at STADT NACH ACHT! And last but not least: Have fun on the dance floor and in the clubs of Berlin.

From 26-28 November 2020 the journey continues in Zurich, Switzerland...

THE NON-VISUAL EFFECT OF LIGHT ON LIVING ORGANISMS.

11:30 — 13:00

The circadian rhythm defines not only our biological rhythm but also the rhythm of the plant and animal kingdoms. A regulated succession of day and night creates this natural cycle. If this succession is influenced by artificial light sources, the natural equilibrium of sleeping and waking

phases gets mixed up. In humans, this can lead to sleep deprivation, attention deficit disorders and depression. In plants and animals, growth, breeding behaviour and orientation are impacted.

Abnormalities are especially prevalent in cities and within the “nocturnal” risk group involved in the creative arts. However, such risk-patterns shift with the influence of new technologies such as LEDs. For example, lighting technicians were initially at a high risk of cancer through exposure to UV light. Nowadays, researchers are more interested in the high proportion of blue light in LED technology, which has been connected to sleep disturbances and the risk of retinal detachment, and is referred to as “Blue Light Hazard.”

Hardly a week goes by without stories about drug use making headlines in the media. This coverage often leads to confusion among experts and politicians alike—but what is the reality? Which substances are consumed by night-time and festival revellers? Are cocaine, amphetamines and ecstasy still in? Or have these substances been replaced by synthetic cathinones (eg. 3-MMC), or new empathogens such as 6-APB, ketamine, and methamphetamines? Is the concentration of MDMA and the purity of cocaine still on the rise? And what's the news concerning cutting agents? Die jüngsten Wahlen in Ostdeutschland haben das aktuelle politische Stimmungsbild klar an den rechten Rand des gesellschaftlichen Spektrums und darüber hinaus verschoben. In Thüringen ist die AfD stärkste Partei bei den unter 60-jährigen geworden. In den Städten und Stadtstaaten ist die Lage nicht ganz so eindeutig. Für linksliberale, alternative oder gar linke Kultureinrichtungen bedeutet es das Ende der Gemütlichkeit-vorsichtig ausgedrückt. Denn neben dem institutionellen Druck fürchten viele Kulturtreibende gerade auf dem Land ein zunehmendes Risiko physischer Gewalt gegen sie selbst, die Einrichtungen und ihre Gäste. Morddrohungen, Anschläge und andere Angriffe gegen Kultureinrichtungen und ihre Macher*innen sind mittlerweile keine Einzelfälle mehr.

Während in Städten wie Berlin ein Schulterschluss der bunten und diversen Kulturlandschaft noch eindrucksvoll gelingt – wie etwa die „AfD weglassen“ Demo im vergangenen Jahr gezeigt hat, sind im ländlichen Raum die Entfernung zwischen den Hotspots alternativer Kultur groß. Solidarität und gegenseitige Hilfestellung ist weit schwieriger zu organisieren.

FROM DARK CORNERS AND NOCTURNAL PLACES: LIGHT & SAFETY IN URBAN SPACES.

Especially "nocturnal" places in the city suffer from the myth of dark corners where dangerous characters lie in wait. To counter this, these corners are often illuminated from above by powerful floodlights. From a human perspective this is completely understandable; the dark corner is now illuminated. Photometrically speaking, exactly the opposite takes place. If one steps out of the dark into this cone of light, one is temporarily blinded until the eyes adjust to the new setting. The dark area outside of the light is perceived to be even darker. The person standing under the light is now even more exposed, while someone in the dark becomes less visible. But how can these nocturnal spaces be better illuminated, to improve safety and wellbeing?

NEGOTIATING CITY LIGHTENING – FROM STREET LIGHTS TO URBAN INTERFACES.

Fueled by the avant-garde and futurism movements, there was an outright competition for the title of "light city" between European metropoles at the beginning of the 20th century. In order to overshadow the French capital—which stood out as an exemplary model for the city that never sleeps—entrepreneurs initiated a spectacular marketing event in 1928, which illuminated "Berlin in Light". As the new "Light City Berlin," the international metropolis also established itself through its entertainment culture and chic lifestyle surrounding the Kurfürstendamm thoroughfare. The urban nightscape became a new habitat, reserved exclusively for city dwellers, and emitted a fascination which could only be explained by the new phenomenon of electrical lighting. Artificial illumination soon became an "expression of progressive, urban culture", thus conveying an ambivalence of progress and the amusement industry.

Nowadays, lighting and more modern technologies offer many new design possibilities for urban illumination, which still play an important role in the image of these cities. We will discuss how these possibilities are implemented, how light can be political, and how we can narrate our city.

Im Jahr 2017 formierte sich innerhalb der Clubcommission der Arbeitskreis Awareness & Diversity, der sich damit auseinandersetzt, wie möglichst sichere und vielfältige Umgebungen innerhalb der Club- und Festivalkultur geschaffen werden können. Gerade für Menschen, die sich in der Mehrheitsgesellschaft unwohl fühlen, haben Clubs eine wichtige, identitätsstiftende Bedeutung und bieten einen geschützten Freiraum für das Ausleben marginalisierter, sozialer und kultureller Praxen. Die Zielsetzung einer diversen und diskriminierungssensiblen Clubkultur ist anspruchsvoll und kann nur durch konti-

d&b has added **NoizCalc** to its software arsenal as there has never been an easy way to predict how sound propagates from the audience listening area to the local surroundings. **NoizCalc** takes complex loudspeaker data and models emissions in the far field using the ISO 9613-2 or Nord2000 calculation standards. Using 3D geographical data, **NoizCalc** overlays an accurate prediction of the transmission effects across the terrain from the audience listening area to the surrounding region. This enables system designers to evaluate the effects of the sound reinforcement system, as well as any potential noise disturbance, during the event planning stage.



More and more European Cities are starting to recognize the loss of cultural identity and the urgent demands for the return of free space. HOW TO KEEP THE BEAUTY OF EXPERIENCE? "SAFE LISTENING" AND "MUSIC IS NOT NOISE!"

Upon request of the Member States in the European Region the World Health Organisation (WHO) published in October 2018 the report "Environmental Noise Guidelines for the European Region". This report goes beyond the requested scope (transportation noise sources, personal electronic devices, toys and wind turbines), and undertook also to study a concept named "Leisure Noise", in which they include "nightclubs... concerts or live music venues" as potentials sources for health damaging noise. Their goals are new global guidelines for a stronger decibel restriction.

LiveDMA, the European association representing more than 3000 clubs, festivals and music venues, sees this categorization of music as noise as incorrect and potentially dangerous, and damaging the right for artistic freedom. Therefore LiveDMA published in summer 2019 the white paper "Music is not Noise":

Music is not only leisure or entertainment. Music is a cultural activity and is imbued with meaning. Music is understood to be a social construct, and its associated activities and rituals, including dance and storytelling, have greater value than leisure alone. Any future environmental noise regulation must safeguard the cultural rights to live music and artistic freedom. Moreover: Current technical possibilities of separating zones of loudness and silence are not part of the WHO discussion which also might lead to unnecessary regulations on issues which can easily be defused by contemporary technical measurements already.

Additional sound regulations would specifically endanger artistic freedom and diversity of certain music genres where loudness is an integral part of the artistic and cathartic process of the performance and live experience. Audiences should have the freedom to make individual informed choices to experience music without limitations, whether that be industrial techno, heavy metal, orchestral music, drone, grime, or any kind of artistic music expression.

This panel will present and discuss the different standpoints of stakeholders and what solutions could be found to balance health aspects, artistic freedom and the beauty of experience.



With the help of Berlin's Noise Emission Fund, many clubs and live music venues in Berlin are able to improve the measurements of sound emissions towards their neighbours. One of the most outstanding success stories of the "fund for urban peace" has been developed for the open-air club Ipse. The club is situated within a cluster of other music venues alongside a small canal and with neighbours living close by. As an open-air club, complaints and actions against the nightlife activities of the clubs—especially Ipse—have been escalating. Neighbours have already formed a citizens' initiative—initiating round table talks with politics and administration to close down the clubs.

With the help of the Noise Emission Fund, an Active Noise Cancelling system was established for the outside dancefloor of the club, eliminating all unwanted frequencies and waveforms. In an individual and technically innovative approach, a small audio company has developed a highly effective solution which allows a full range sound on the open-air dancefloor, while a couple of meters away from the sources you soundwise hardly would guess there's a massive party going on next to you. Besides an intelligent and complex solution for the bass, a four-meter wide sound horn has been installed for the higher frequencies.

Whoever is interested to see the installation with his / her own eyes and is curious about the simulation and development process of that installation is invited to join our little excursion to Ipse club. We'll be back for the following break in time.


London-born, Berlin-based producer, songwriter and DJ Sasha Perera (Jahcoozi) performs with her highly acclaimed project Perera Elsewhere.

On Saturday, November 30th, 2019, Berlin's renowned club 'TRESOR' will be hosting the 4th annual public day of the Stadt Nach Acht - Frei(T)räume (free dreaming-free space) conference. From a very beginning, we have been embraced by the Stadt Nach Acht, with a given trust, freedom and support to unite narratives from the club culture worldwide and express our curatorial vision. We are strengthening rave culture and insisting on protecting free spaces.

We recognize that such a way of living can form an active political body and fruitful alternative in times of urgency. That clubbing is more than entertainment, and it can define space and terms in which we are living. Frei(t)räume generated a strong activist network bringing changes on a socio-political level and giving context and voice to rave-culture. Those years of working together shaped ideas that are the topic of this year's event DANCE and SPACE OF URGENCY.

The dance of urgency is a dance that arises from the emotions that occur in times of personal and collective crisis. It aims to empower individuals and collectives. This dance has its momentum, it is not constant. The body is sensory, and it expresses itself in movement. Sometimes dance creates a space, sometimes in order, that dance can happen, we need a space. In times of gentrification, right-wing populism and climate change significance of free space are on its rise, this is a space of urgency. The dance of urgency is not any longer an "exotic" narrative from far

away, it is happening now in Europe too. In the past few months, various protests have adopted the rave format, like antifascist protests (Berlin), Rave 4 Climate (Paris), Brexit Protest Rave (London), against gentrification (Berlin and Rotterdam), Free Human Rights Open Air (Vienna), for climate etc. How to create models for spaces where social, cultural and political urgencies can organize, interact and multiply? What are the values and access criteria of such areas? How can we apply those values into movement and allow it to resonate from bodies to space and from space into bodies? How do we defend free space in times of capital and rise of the property value?

The stage will be offered to a wide variety of dedicated musicians, scientists, and urban change-makers who are all at the forefront of their respective movements and are effectively causing a cross-pollination of the local and international rave and club-culture communities around the globe. Visionary underground electronic music collectives from Georgia, Palestine, Azerbaijan, Ukraine, Brazil, USA, Australia and all across the EU, will emphasize their own unique urgent situations surrounding the topics of Dance and Space of Urgency.

During the day, the culturally historic club space of Tresor will be hosting workshops, discussions and screenings. At night the conference will transform into a 'Dance of Urgency' club night at Tresor, resonating and amplifying the sounds of some of the conference's key speakers.

SELF-ORGANISATION VS. OVERREGULATION: FREE SPACE VALUES AS A CATALYST FOR URBAN CHANGE

Rapid urban development has made looking back into the history of free spaces increasingly urgent. Today, more than ever, it seems we have to remind ourselves of what a free space means. In the discussion, we will explore examples of self-organized bodies from London, Amsterdam and Berlin. Our panellists will share their memories and perspectives of these spaces; how their actions shaped cities, but also got them pushed away.

What knowledge can we extract from self-organized rave and festival culture? How have past movements contributed to the core identity of free spaces in cities around the world? How could models based on such practices influence future urban planning developments worldwide?

DETROIT-BERLIN: TAPPING INTO THE NIGHT

Detroit and dance culture are synonymous. Motown songs and techno tracks bring positive energy to the mind and move the body, regardless of time and place. Yet in Detroit itself dancing is prohibited after 2 a.m. This discussion now being led by the Detroit-Berlin Connection aims to shed light on how local laws must be changed to allow 24 hour expression of what the city does best: innovate, produce raw music power, change the world.

The Detroit-Berlin Connection is leading efforts to end a decades-long dance curfew from 2 to 7:30 a.m. in the city. The laws stretch back to a time when auto industry and political leaders in Detroit, along with the state's Liquor Control Commission, aimed to limit hours of entertainment as a way to protect business interests - as well as reduce late night options for people of color in neighborhoods like Black Bottom-Paradise Valley, which flourished with jazz and blues clubs in the 1930s and 1940s. But those neighborhoods were demolished to make way for interstate highways and other urban renewal projects in the 1950s. Sadly, they no longer exist.

SPACE OF URGENCY - THE STRATEGY

The second panel will further develop this topic, focusing on the role of free space development now and in the future. What's next? After countless anti-gentrification protests, political lobbying and free space movements, some European cities are starting to recognize a loss of cultural identity and an urgent demand for the return of free spaces.

As a result, various research projects are taking place, with the aim of developing effective strategies for implementing new urban policies. The panellists will discuss the current plan of action for the creation of "spaces of urgency" which could be implemented

SPACE OF URGENCY – THE STRATEGY: WHAT'S NEXT?

We continue with a panel that will focus on the topic and role of free space development now and in the future. What is next? After countless anti-gentrification protests, political lobbyist and free space movements, some of European Cities are starting to recognize the loss of cultural identity and the urgent demands for the return of free spaces. To do so, various projects and researches are taking place. They all look for strategies and how urban policies can be formed. The panellists highlight the current plan for the creation of spaces of urgency for future implementation worldwide.

DANCE OF URGENCY

Dance of urgency is a dance that rises in the time of personal and collective crises and that aim to empower individuals and groups. The term has been defined by Bogomir Doringer one of the curators of the event Freiraume. Drawing from his memories of dancing during NATO bombing in Belgrade in 1999, he started research into club culture, and its transformative potential. How it transforms one, collective, space, cities, countries etc. Through Freiraume meetings and network created, he has been following a rise of dances with political urgency. In this part of the evening, we will look into how the dance of urgency creates a space of urgency. But also how so that dance can happen space is needed. The role of art plays an essential part in Doringer's research and in this part of the program.

OMSK SOCIAL CLUB

Rave a place that credits pure emotion is the hardest and safest space Omsk Social Club ever found ourselves to be inside. The Rave structure has continually informed our immersive role-playing practice with its collective narratives, chimaera illusion and off-world structures. Looking at living bodies, systematic codes of mutual care and the human strike Omsk Social Club continually creates works that encompass disconnection concepts and pathways for this life and the next. It forks traditional methods of Live Action Role Play (Larp) through immersive installations and into Real Game Play (RGP) to induce states that could potentially be a fiction or a yet, unlivid reality.

RECLAIM CHOREOMANIA

We often hear about Choreomania as almost a bizarre and unexplained phenomenon. „Dancing mania (also known as dancing plague, choreomania) was a social phenomenon that occurred primarily in mainland Europe between the 14th and 17th centuries. It involved groups of people dancing erratically sometimes thousands at a time.“ To ravers, such an image sounds very familiar.

Drawing from Dr Kelina's Gotman work in the book Choreomania: Dance and Disorder, this talk will think through the notion of „wild“ dancing – dancing that transcends or disrupts habitual cultures of collective corporeal life. What it means to dance in a way that is natural, unbridled, „wild“ or untamed – as well as disorderly – this talk will aim to reclaim „choreomania“. To think another order of „epidemic dancing“, dancing that refuses to heed no trespassing zones and refuses to submit to diurnal rules of productive labour.

MOMENTUM (DANCING A SPACE)

Our international guests will introduce spaces and values that they have been creating the last years through dance. Dancing together created a force that gained visibility for regions and cities where they are based and reminded us of the original values of rave culture/togetherness and synchronicity. These values are disturbed World Wide. We will hear from panellists how they use dance as a way of uniting people, creating a powerful collective body and creative art and music scene. The dance of urgency is temporary, it is momentum. How to maintain values within the community and spaces for new generations and within changing social-political circumstances?

THE POLITICS OF ECSTASY

When analysing contemporary and ancient political motives behind the repression of the collective altered states of consciousness, we can see the repetition of a dynamic of polarisation between those who support the need for these spaces vs those who oppose them. In this interactive conversation with the public, we will reflect on the current systems of raving repression, concerning the latest anti rave laws in France. But also to the American „Rave Act“ (Reducing American vulnerability to Ecstasy Act 2003) the British „Repetitive Beats Act“ (Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 1994) and invite a debate on how we can become aware of the motives behind both perspectives and how to transcend the need for polarization, in order to reach a less repressive, yet safer and more conscious and mature approach to raving.

RED LIGHT RADIO

All Artists that are highlighted during their Red Light Radio live-stream have their own unique way of creating 'Spaces of urgency' for minorities, LGBT+ communities and safe spaces for radical self-expression in general. Every performance start with a 15 minute visual and moderated presentation, where the artist/collective gives us a glimp into their local environments and how their concepts/events contribute and offer empowerment to the values of inclusive club & rave culture. All interviews are conducted and curated by Pedro Marum from mina collective (Lissbon).

RAVE AWARENESS

The Awareness Workshop aims to provide you with basic information on the subject of discrimination and violence in the event and party context. There will be space for examination of one's own experiences (from both personal and professional context) intended to sensitize you to the topic of potential problems and designate one's own field of power and motivation to change structures towards a more attentive celebration culture. We will work on example situations to discuss solutions together, to strengthen the capability to handle them and to open a space for ideas and opportunities for change.

The exhibition project No Photos on the Dance Floor! Berlin 1989–Today documents the history of Berlin's club scene since the fall of the Wall and brings that history to life in club nights at C/O Berlin. “For me, a club is a big abstraction machine that constantly produces pictures. They're often on the edge of the visible, when the fog rises and you look up toward the ceiling and watch the lights. Intangible things shimmer and flicker through there.”—Wolfgang Tillmans

After the Berlin Wall fell in 1989, clubs, bars, galleries, and studios began popping up everywhere, filling empty buildings, factories, and vacant lots with life. This young club and cultural scene became the driving force behind the city's rejuvenation, pointing the way for a new generation of young creatives. And while techno was not invented in Berlin, what was happening in the city during this period at events like Tekknosid and in clubs like Ufo, Tresor, and Planet can be seen as a kind of “big bang”—the inception of the last major youth culture movement in Europe to date. The visual and artistic approaches of Berlin's club life occupied a boundary zone at the intersection of video, film, projections, and music, offering for many aspiring artists new perspectives and spaces for communication, interaction, and celebration. At the turn of the millennium, a new wave of clubs with parties that never seemed to stop drew increasing numbers of techno fans from around the world to the capital city, bringing new influences to the city's sound—a process that continues to this day.
